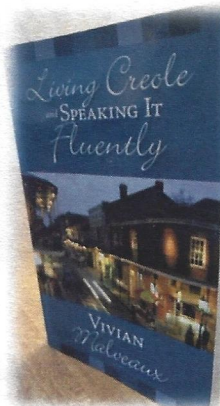

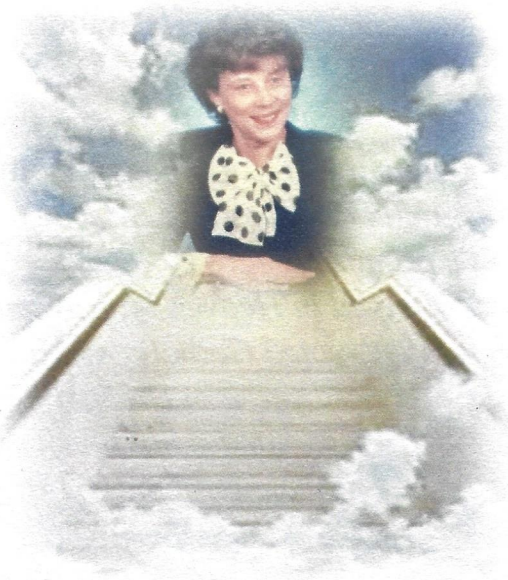
Vivian's journey of faith began with her loving parents, Felix and Beatrice Briscoe and her belief in God's promise.
